Reorganization meeting continued

Since Neshaminy school board members did not agree on who should be vice president during their reorganization meeting earlier this week, the board will continue that meeting at 7 p.m. Monday.

The session will be held in Herbert Hoover Elementary School at 501 Trenton Road in Middletown.

While Neshaminy officials elected Ritchie Webb as president in a 5-4 vote, several motions failed nominating Frank Koziol, Kim Koutsouradis and Joseph Blasch as vice president. Koziol previously held that seat.

After the continuation of that meeting, the Neshaminy school board will hold another strategic action committee meeting to discuss possibly implementing a full-day kindergarten program and where to house the Tawanka alternative program. The Lower Southampton building could be leased to the Bucks County Intermediate Unit No. 22 by September 2009, administrators said.

Although officials had previously talked about placing Tawanka at the district's Eisenhower office facility in Middletown, administrators recently proposed a cheaper option — keeping it in a wing that was to be demolished at Neshaminy High School, officials said.

Parents, teachers and Tawanka's 53 students have previously asked that the program remain in an isolation location. The program is designed for the teens who aren't successful in a traditional high school setting.

The board will also discuss possibly conducting another facilities study of the district's elementary schools. For more information, call 215-809-6000.
